 Proposed Amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 74, <u>Curriculum Requirements</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Required Curriculum</u>, §74.5, <u>Academic Achievement Record (Transcript) and High School Diploma</u> (First Reading and Filing Authorization) (Committee on Instruction)

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization proposed amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 74, Curriculum Requirements, Subchapter A, Required Curriculum, §74.5, Academic Achievement Record (Transcript) and High School Diploma, to update the rule to align with recent legislative changes. The changes delete the requirements that a high school diploma note when a student has earned endorsements, performance acknowledgments or a distinguished level of achievement. The academic achievement record will still list these accomplishments.

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization proposed new 19 TAC Chapter 126, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Technology Applications, Subchapter D, Other Technology Applications Courses, §126.65, Advanced Placement (AP) Computer Science Principles (One Credit), Adopted 2016. (3) Recommendations Regarding Renewal of Instructional Materials Contracts (Committee on Instruction)

The board approved the renewal of instructional materials contracts that expire on August 31, 2016. This action affects products adopted through Proclamation 2010 (English and Spanish Language Arts and Reading, English I and II for Speakers of Other Languages, and English Language Proficiency Standards, grades 9-12) and ensures that these materials remain available for distribution to school districts until new materials become available.

The board recommended that staff allow the agreement with Mesirow Advanced Strategies, Inc., for its services as manager of the Raven 2 LLC to expire on its current expiration date of Feb. 29, 2016; to ask staff to negotiate an acceptable agreement with Grosvenor to become the Raven 2 liquidator; to authorize PSF staff to create a new Raven 8, funded with the assets from Raven 2 structured so that PSF staff will act as a fully discretionary hedge fund investment manager and, subject to an acceptable agreement, Grosvenor will be responsible for managing Raven 8 operations. All contract execution is delegated to the commissioner of education.

The decision adds Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for a new personal financial literacy one-half credit elective course.

The board approved for second reading and final adoption proposed new 19 TAC Chapter 74, Curriculum Requirements, Subchapter A, Required Curriculum, §74.6, College and Career Readiness and Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills Alignment. This action adopts charts indicating the alignment of the College and Career Readiness Standards (CCRS) for mathematics, science, social studies, and cross disciplinary subjects and the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), as required by House Bill (HB) 1613, 84th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2015.

10. Proposed New 19 TAC Chapter 127, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills</u> for Career Development, Subchapter B, <u>High School</u>, §127.16, <u>Extended</u> <u>Career Preparation (One Credit), Adopted 2016</u> (First Reading and Filing Authorization)

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization proposed new 19 TAC Chapter 127, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Career Development, Subchapter B, High School, §127.16, Extended Career Preparation (One Credit), Adopted 2016. The proposal would add Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for a new career preparation course to allow students to earn up to a total of three credits each in Career Preparation I and Career Preparation II. The proposal recommends an implementation date of the 2017-2018 school year.

12. Review of Proposed Amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 242, <u>Superintendent</u> <u>Certificate</u>, §242.20, <u>Requirements for the Issuance of the Standard Supe-</u> <u>rintendent Certificate</u>

The SBOE took no action on the review of the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) rule action that amends the requirements for the issuance of the standard superintendent certificate. The amended rule provides an individual seeking a superintendent certificate the option to substitute three years of managerial experience in a public school district for the requirement of a principal certificate.

The SBOE, under Texas law, may only veto proposed SBEC rules or take no action.

13. Review of Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 227, <u>Provisions for</u> <u>Educator Preparation Candidates</u>

The SBOE took no action on the review of State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) rule actions that revise the provisions for entry into an educator preparation program. The amendments to, and proposed new rules, include changes as a result of House Bill (HB) 2012, 83rd Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, which required the Texas Education Agency (TEA), the SBEC, and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) to perform a joint review of the existing standards for preparation and admission that are applicable to educator preparation programs (EPPs). Changes are also included as a result of HB 2205 and HB 1300, 84th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2015. The revisions update the rules to reflect current law, clarify minimum standards for all EPPs, allow for flexibility, and ensure consistency among EPPs in the state. Under the new rules, an applicant to an Educator Preparation Program must have either a 2.5 grade point average (GPA) or a 2.5 GPA in the last 60 semester credit hours; and require the overall GPA of each incoming class to a preparatory program to be not less than a 3.00 on a four-point scale or the equivalent.

The SBOE, under Texas law, may only veto proposed SBEC rules or take no action.
