1. Resolutions and Presentations

The board passed a resolution recognizing Miguel Padilla, a student at Harmony School of Innovation in Fort Worth, as the only Texan and one of only 10 students in the United States to earn a perfect score on the Advanced Placement Computer Science A test.

The board approved a resolution designating February as Career and Technical Education Month and noted that this marked the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Smith-Hughes Act, federal legislation which launched support for vocational education.

The board approved a resolution congratulating the 2016 state finalists for the Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching. State finalists for mathematics are Deborah Cunningham, Garland Independent School District (ISD); Ashley Dodson, Allen ISD; Robert Rivera, Brownsville ISD; Misty Ruth, Pasadena ISD and Deborah Swyers, Round Rock ISD. The state finalists for science are Rubi deHoyos, Northside ISD (San Antonio); Kirk Evans, Allen ISD; Denise Koontz, Keller ISD; Andrea Miller, Mesquite ISD; and Kelly Spradley, Little Elm ISD.
