Recruiting and Preparing Teachers and Principals

The Texas Education Agency (TEA) is pleased to announce the opening of grant opportunities for the 2019–2021 *Grow Your Own*, Cycle 2 and 2019–2020 *Principal Preparation*, Cycle 2 grant programs.

The 2019–2021 *Grow Your Own*, Cycle 2 grant can be used by districts to encourage high school students to consider teaching as a career and paraprofessionals and/or teacher aides to pursue certification. The grants can also be used by educator preparation programs to support student teachers during their year-long clinical teaching or teaching candidates during their intensive preservice training.

The 2019–2020 *Principal Preparation*, Cycle 2 grant can be used by districts to cover preparation/certification costs and implement a full-time, year-long residency for their aspiring principals. Both grants are in support of the Agency's Strategic Priority to recruit, support, and retain teachers and principals.
