Pathway 2: Transition of Paraprofessionals, Instructional Aides, and Long-Term Substitutes to Full-Time Teaching Roles

Program Participants: Applicant must specify the number of paraprofessionals, instructional aides, and/or long-term substitutes who will participate in the program and receive the stipend.

Five teachers

Teacher Recruitment and Selection Process: Applicant must articulate how they plan to recruit and select high potential paraprofessionals, instructional aides and/or long-term substitutes to participate in the program and receive the grant stipend to pursue their bachelor's degree and/or teacher certification.

- The plan must address their process for identifying participants, with potential indicators including evaluation ratings, involvement in school activities, recommendations from colleagues, etc.
- The plan must also address how the applicant has considered the following in their recruitment strategy: pursuit of certification in hard-to-staff areas and degree to which the diversity of the teacher population mirrors that of the student population.

Lumin has a small pool of teachers that are eligible for this program. In determining who can participate, we will give preference to teachers with Montessori certification, who have been with Lumin Education for at least 2 years, have a record of successful parent involvement and are recommended by their principal for participation.

Lumin Education is a public Montessori program located in traditionally underserved neighborhood. Our teacher recruitment focuses on candidates who reflect our student population. We will make efforts to educate and encourage all teachers to apply to participate in this program.

For the teachers selected for this program, Lumin will ask them to execute an agreement to remain in a full time teaching role at Lumin throughout the grant period and for two years after they receive their certification, making their commitment 4 years.
