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# Grade 7 Writing Expository Prompt

- use correct spelling, capitalization, punctuation, grammar, and sentences

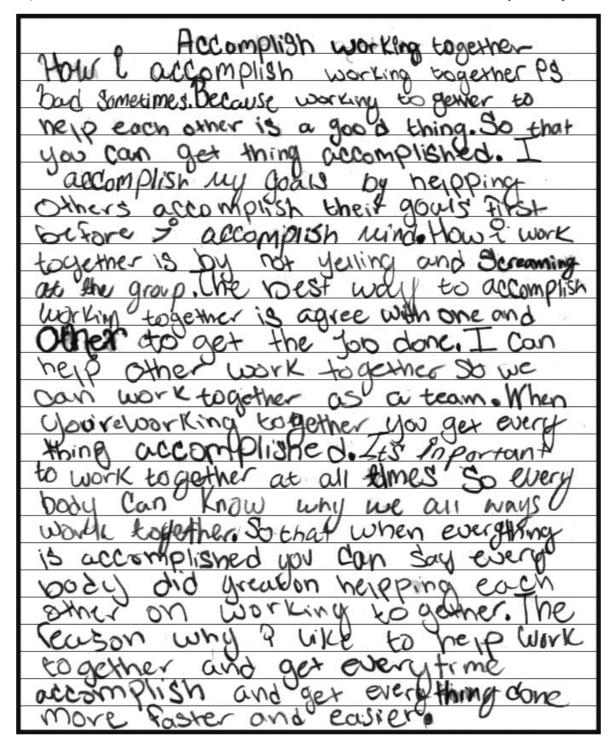
# The essay represents a very limited writing performance.

Organ	<u>ization/Progression</u>	
	The organizing structure of the essay is inappropriate to the purpose or the specific demands of the prompt. The writer uses organizational strategies that are only marginally suited to the explanatory task, or they are inappropriate or not evident at all. The absence of a functional organizational structure causes the essay to lack clarity and direction.	
	Most ideas are generally related to the topic specified in the prompt, but the controlling idea is missing, unclear, or illogical. The writer may fail to maintain focus on the topic, may include extraneous information, or may shift abruptly from idea to idea, weakening the coherence of the essay.	
	The writer's progression of ideas is weak. Repetition or wordiness sometimes causes serious disruptions in the essay. At other times the lack of transitions and sentence-to-sentence connections causes the writer to present ideas in a random or illogical way, making the essay unclear or difficult to follow.	
Development of Ideas		
	The development of ideas is weak. The essay is ineffective because the writer uses details and examples that are inappropriate, vague, or insufficient.	
	The essay is insubstantial because the writer's response to the prompt is vague or confused. In some cases, the essay as a whole is only weakly linked to the prompt. In other cases, the writer develops the essay in a manner that demonstrates a lack of understanding of the expository writing task.	
Use of	Language/Conventions	
	The writer's word choice may be vague or limited. It reflects little or no awareness of the expository purpose and does not establish a tone appropriate to the task. The word choice may impede the quality and clarity of the essay.	
	Sentences are very awkward or uncontrolled, significantly limiting the effectiveness of the essay.	
	The writer no command of sentence boundaries and/or little or no command of spelling. Serious and persistent errors in capitalization, punctuation, grammar, and usage conventions may create disruptions in the fluency of the writing and sometimes interfere with meaning.

#### Score Point 1

The writer of this very limited response tells a story about working with a team during an important football game. A narrative organizational strategy is used, which is inappropriate to the specific demands of the expository task. The essay is ineffective because the details describing each play during the game do not contribute to a controlling idea. In addition, persistent errors in conventions create disruptions in the fluency of the writing.



In this example of a very limited writing performance, the writer attempts to support a weak controlling idea (When you're working together you get everything accomplished). However, repetition and wordiness cause serious disruptions in the essay and inhibit meaningful development.

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The writer of this response presents a controlling idea (Working with other people is a smart way to get know each other) and uses a cause and effect technique to progress logically from one idea to the next. However, the essay is ineffective because the writer includes a few vague details that do not sufficiently or effectively support the controlling idea.

In this essay the writer provides some examples of ways people can work together. The absence of a functional organizational structure, though, causes the essay to lack clarity and direction. Repetition causes serious disruptions, and the lack of sentence-to-sentence connections results in a random presentation of ideas. The essay is insubstantial because the writer does not develop any idea beyond the stimulus in the prompt. In addition, the writer's limited word choice and serious and persistent conventions errors make this a very limited writing performance.

# The essay represents a basic writing performance.

Organization/Progression		
٦	The organizing structure of the essay is evident but may not always be appropriate to the purpose or the specific demands of the prompt. The essay is not always clear because the writer uses organizational strategies that are only somewhat suited to the expository task.	
	Most ideas are generally related to the topic specified in the prompt, but the writer's controlling idea is weak or somewhat unclear. The lack of an effective controlling idea or the writer's inclusion of irrelevant information interferes with the focus and coherence of the essay.	
	The writer's progression of ideas is not always logical and controlled. Sometimes repetition or wordiness causes minor disruptions in the flow of the essay. At other times transitions and sentence-to-sentence connections are too perfunctory or weak to support the flow of the essay or show the relationships among ideas.	
Devel	opment of Ideas	
	The development of ideas is minimal. The essay is superficial because the writer uses details and examples that are not always appropriate or are too briefly or partially presented.	
ū	The essay reflects little or no thoughtfulness. The writer's response to the prompt may be artificial and rely on forced patterns of development. In any case, the writer develops the essay in a manner that demonstrates only a basic understanding of the expository writing task.	
Use of Language/Conventions		
	The writer's word choice may be general or imprecise. It reflects a basic awareness of the expository purpose but does little to establish a tone appropriate to the task. The word choice may not contribute to the quality and clarity of the essay.	
	Sentences may be simplistic, awkward, or only somewhat controlled, weakening the effectiveness of the essay.	
	The writer demonstrates a partial command of sentence boundaries and spelling, capitalization, punctuation, grammar, and usage conventions. Distracting errors may be evident, creating some disruptions in the fluency or meaning of the	

writing, but there is evidence of complete sentences and correct spelling.

The writer lists a number of ways in which people can "accomplish a lot" by working together. The ideas included in the essay are generally related to the topic specified in the prompt, but the controlling idea is weak (Well people can accomplish a lot...). The progression of ideas is not always logical and controlled; the flow of the essay is interrupted by some irrelevant information explaining the reason why some people are unsuccessful at working in groups. The development of ideas is superficial because the writer briefly lists details and examples as support of the controlling idea but does not stop to develop them more fully. Although conventions errors are evident, the writer demonstrates a partial command of sentence boundaries, capitalization, punctuation, grammar, and usage.

#### **Score Point 2**

In this basic writing performance, the writer lists and attempts to briefly explain ways in which working together is important. Although the ideas are generally related to the specified topic, weak transitions and lack of an effective controlling idea interfere with the focus and coherence of the essay. In addition, the writer's partial command of conventions and general word choice do not contribute to the quality or clarity of the essay.

#### **Score Point 2**

In this response the writer lists several examples of activities that involve working with other people. However, the somewhat unclear controlling idea (You are going to accomplish many things; Working together is going to make a different in life) interferes with the focus and coherence of the essay. The writer's progression of ideas is not always logical due to the lack of transitions and weak sentence-to-sentence connections. Although the baseball example is specific and appropriate, development overall is superficial since many of the details provided are not appropriate or too briefly presented. Awkwardly constructed sentences, a partial command of sentence boundaries, as well as grammar and usage errors weakens the effectiveness of the essay.

The writer of this basic response includes the weak controlling idea that working with people is important because they can help you. The progression of ideas is not always logical and controlled because repetition (someone can help, find people to help, thing's always go smoother with help, help comes in handy) causes minor disruptions in the flow of the essay and impedes more specific and appropriate development.

# The essay represents a satisfactory writing performance.

<u>Organ</u>	<u>ization/Progression</u>		
	The organizing structure of the essay is, for the most part, appropriate to the purpose and responsive to the specific demands of the prompt. The essay is clear because the writer uses organizational strategies that are adequately suited to the expository task.		
	The writer establishes a clear controlling idea. Most ideas are related to the controlling idea and are focused on the topic specified in the prompt. The essay is coherent, though it may not always be unified due to minor lapses in focus.		
	The writer's progression of ideas is generally logical and controlled. For the most part, transitions are meaningful, and sentence-to-sentence connections are sufficient to support the flow of the essay and show the relationships among ideas.		
Development of Ideas			
	The development of ideas is sufficient because the writer uses details and examples that are specific and appropriate, adding some substance to the essay.		
	The essay reflects some thoughtfulness and may engage the reader. The writer's response to the prompt may be original or may connect ideas in interesting ways based on his/her view of the world. In any case, the writer develops the essay in a manner that demonstrates a good understanding of the expository writing task.		
Use of	f Language/Conventions		
	The writer's word choice is, for the most part, clear and specific. It reflects an awareness of the expository purpose and establishes a tone appropriate to the task. The word choice usually contributes to the quality and clarity of the essay.		
	Sentences are varied and adequately controlled, for the most part contributing to the effectiveness of the essay.		
	The writer demonstrates an adequate command of sentence boundaries and spelling, capitalization, punctuation, grammar, and usage conventions. Although some errors may be evident, they create only minor disruptions in the fluency of the writing, and they do not affect the clarity of the essay.

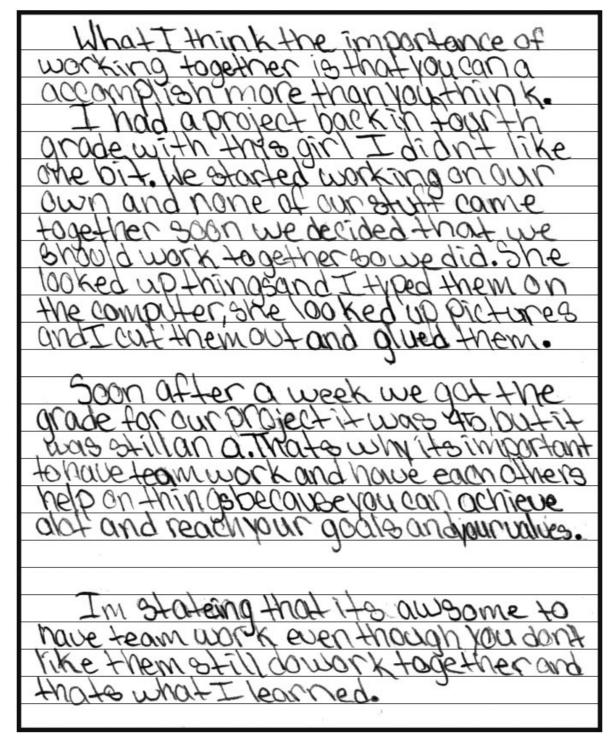
#### **Score Point 3**

In this satisfactory writing performance, the writer uses the first and final statements of the essay to establish a clear controlling idea focused on explaining how working is "the thing that keeps this world going round." The ideas are related to the controlling idea and focused on the topic specified in the prompt. Although the writer only minimally develops the ideas in the technology section, the remainder of the response is developed sufficiently with specific and appropriate details and examples that add some substance to the response. The clear word choice demonstrates an awareness of the expository purpose and contributes to the quality and clarity of the essay. While some conventions errors are evident, they create only minor disruptions in the fluency of the writing.

#### **Score Point 3**

In this thoughtful and engaging response, the writer focuses on the benefits of working with others. The writer uses a compare and contrast organizational strategy to address the advantages of working together and the disadvantages of working alone. The progression of ideas is generally logical and controlled. The development of ideas is sufficient because the writer uses details and examples that are specific and appropriate, reflecting the writer's view of the world and adding some substance to the essay. Although some conventions errors are evident, they do not affect the clarity of the response. Overall, the essay represents a satisfactory writing performance.



In this concise essay, the writer uses the first and last paragraphs to provide a clear controlling idea: with teamwork you can accomplish more than you think, even if you don't like your teammate. A relevant narrative example about working on a school project supports the controlling idea. This organizational strategy is adequately suited to the expository task and helps to clarify the writer's position. The details the writer provides are specific and appropriate, adding some substance to the response. The result is a satisfactory writing performance.

The writer of this satisfactory response provides a clear controlling idea (It's good to work with each other because you can get a lot of stuff done). The writer supports this idea with a number of specific and appropriate examples, adding some substance to the essay and developing it in a manner that demonstrates a good understanding of the expository writing task. Word choice is, for the most part, clear and specific, and contributes to the quality of the response.
