lesso of th edTF com the f	Our May 2021 curriculum alignment process included and analysis of PPR exam data and an analysis of student teacher lesson plans. While our PPR scores indicated that our students were able to demonstrate their understanding or knowledge of the PPR standards in a multiple-choice test, their lesson plans did not demonstrate this knowledge. By embedding the edTPA tasks and expectations such as justifying choices, connecting to evidence-based practices, self-reflection and commentary, this EPP believes the teacher candidate will not only know, but be able to show, through demonstration, that the have mastered the PPR standards. Teacher candidates who will go through the edTPA process will be better prepared for the decisions necessary to design effective instruction and classroom environments.
