TEA Program Requirements

1. Identification of Needs: Describe your plan for identifying dual credit faculty needs for this grant, as well as in the future. What systems will you put in place to ensure each CCRSM cohort is offered a sequence of coursework which will lead to a postsecondary credential?

All considerations for dual credit faculty credentialing would be limited to the required course requirements as outlined by an Associates of Liberal Arts Degree with an emphasis on core courses. These courses would be inclusive of the core requirements that are identifiable as "transferable". Systems of advising for students would continue to ensure that students are guided toward the necessary courses to become "core complete" (at minimum) while pursuing an Associates of Liberal Arts Degree as desired. With many courses moving towards online instruction (as an alternative during COVID pandemic), students have preferred to focus on the 42-core hours/courses as the priority. Educators will be limited to teaching dual credit courses that are outlined on the ECHS crosswalk. Each educator will coordinate with the college department to ensure that the sequence of graduate coursework will lead to postsecondary credentialing.

2. Program Design: Name the university partner(s) which will provide graduate level instruction to participating educators. Describe in detail how the LEA will coordinate with the university partner(s) to design an accelerated credentialing program. What are the university's roles and responsibilities in building a program to expand the number of educators credentialed to teacher college courses?

Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi and Texas A&M University-Kingsville will be the main providers of graduate level instruction to participating educators due to location and proximity. Unless an educator has already started a graduate program at a different institution this will be considered. The universities will provide both on-site and on-line courses to educators to accelerate courses needed for the accelerated credentialing program. The universities are readily available to support the graduate enrollments for educators each term (Fall, Spring, and Summer). The universities will provide a listing of current graduate offerings for the identified areas of need.

TEA Program Requirements (Cont'd)

3. Hiring: Name the dual credit provider(s) who will hire educators. How will the applicant collaborate with the dual credit provider? What steps will take place to ensure that the courses taken by the educator will meet the accrediting standards of the hiring dual credit provider? What are the roles and responsibilities of the hiring dual credit provider?

Del Mar College will consider hiring credentialed staff as needed and/or determined. These procedures and processes will be coordinated with the Department Chairs within each Division of Del Mar College. The roles and responsibilities of hiring will be evaluated through a current service agreement that exists within the Corpus Christi ISD. As of today, there is no exchange of funds to hire; however, Del Mar College provides the necessary approval for the ISD educators to become credentialed to offer college courses on the high school campus. The roles and responsibilities of the ISD educator is expected to adhere to the same implementations provided by all DMC Faculty.

4. Sustainability Plan: Describe the sustainability plan to be implemented which can support the ongoing efforts of the CCRSM campus(es) to address capacity challenges for offering college-level courses beyond the life of the grant. How will the applicant build upon the success of this program to expand college course offerings for high school students in the future.

The more educators that become dual credit credentialed allows more flexibility for course offerings. Due to the complexities of the master schedule, there is not much flexibility or choice in determining when college courses are available with specified times. If the campus was able to control some of the variables that hinder the current master schedule and had more autonomy to offer college courses where needed with approved ISD educators, this would allow for more growth with increased sections and enrollment. Within the master schedule, it is customary for students to be strategically placed in courses that would provide additional support and reinforcement where needed.

TEA Program Requirements (Cont'd)

5. Recruitment and Retention: How were teachers identified and recruited? What new practices will be put into place to support their completion of the accelerated credentialing program? What commitment has the applicant made to educators to ensure that they will be able to teach college courses upon satisfaction of meeting credentialing requirements? What commitment has the applicant asked of educators to ensure that they will continue to serve the CCRSM beyond the grant period to teach college-level courses?

Educators are identified and recruited based upon interest of content knowledge and/or expertise. Those educators with current Masters Degrees were considered first as a priority because they will be able to complete the necessary graduate-level coursework and credentialing procedures sooner. These educators are encouraged to become dual-credit credentialed to provide more accessibility for students and more flexibility with planning the master schedule. A commitment from interested educators will include a minimum of at least three years of service from the time of completion of the dual credit credentialing process to teach dual credit courses. In addition, each educator will meet the requirements of Del Mar College to fulfill the necessary coursework to be eligible to teach dual credit. The goal for each campus is to have a minimum of 1 dual credit teacher within each core department. This will allow for more collaboration within Del Mar College as the educators become part of the instructional network within their assigned college departments.

Budget Narrative

The budget will be kept simple to support the needs and goals of the program by allowing access to more college courses to early college high school students. The budget will be limited to instructional expenses (6300) supplies, college textbooks, etc) and tuition reimbursements (6400) for interested educators. The disbursement plan will be limited to reimbursable costs for each educator. To avoid any anticipated risks, adjustments upon evaluation may be necessary to ensure efficiency of the project with expected goals and outcomes. Educators will be asked for feedback to assess timelines as coursework is planned, available, and completed.
