
HIGHLIGHTS

- Board engaged in Lone Star Governance Training resulting in defined board goals and Theory of Action
- Launched a citywide "Listen and Learn" tour with strong response
- Enrollment has increased by 22% over the past 10 years (including an increase by 1,000 students over the past year alone)
- Entered this school year with approximately 98% of its need for teachers fulfilled
- Over the past **one year**, MISD **reduced its number of IR campuses by ~56%** (from 9 campuses to 4 campuses), down from 11 campuses in 2015
- Initiated and expanded several innovative school partnerships including the below:
 - Early College High School expansion @Midland College
 - Carver Center (Gifted and Talented Elementary Campus)
 - Sam Houston (College Prep Elementary Campus)
 - Launched Health Science and Technology campus (partnership with Midland Memorial Hospital and Midland College)
 - Petroleum Academy (partnership with industry)

TEA has created the conditions for districts like Midland to innovate and accelerate access to high quality schools for all kids in our community



Districts that want to take action have a variety of ways to accelerate opportunities for their kids via support from TEA.



All of these grant programs give significant priority points to applicants who give contractually protected autonomies to the schools.



Increased flexibilities and incentives under SB 1882 have helped catalyze partnerships in service of increasing educational opportunities for all Midland kids. *Partners would sign an MOU with the district with clear autonomies and accountability based on Midland's school performance framework.*

MISD's vision is to ensure all of Midland's students graduate prepared and ready for college or career. MISD is looking for innovation inside the district as well as outside to ensure that every Midland child has access to a high quality school.

To realize this vision, MISD is committed to establishing and nurturing new in-district partnerships to cultivate, augment, and recruit the best leadership and talent to serve Midland's children.

Examples:

- Partnerships on talent to support MISD's current and future educators
- Innovative programs (e.g. focused on College & Career Success, STEM / Personalized Learning, and Mentorships / Externships / Internships)
- Explore in-district charter partnerships

Through the Call for Quality Schools, MISD is seeking partners inside the district as well as outside to design new and reimagine existing in-district schools to support our most at-need students.

- 30 applications from 22 separate entities
 - 7 Internal applications received
- 14 entities (22 ideas) interviewed over 3 days
- 12 ideas moved forward in the process (5 internal)
- *Currently in due diligence phase to determine partnership and determine opening year*

Midland on the Move is the district's transformation effort to make this a reality as we pursue becoming a System of Great Schools.






What is System of Great Schools (SGS)?

That can occur through directly managed schools that meet diverse needs, as well as partnership schools that meet a shared, rigorous vision of student success in Midland








SB 1882 – Securing More Resources for Midland Students in a Challenging Fiscal Environment




SB 1882 is an opportunity to *partner with high quality school operators and secure additional resources for Midland students in a challenging fiscal environment.*









Student Membership Trend
