

1. What students are eligible for the P-EBT benefit?

P-EBT is for children 5-18 years old who received SNAP food benefits for the month of March 2020 and children up to 21 years old who are certified for free or reduced-price meals at school in Texas during the 2019-20 school year as part of the National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program. This includes:

- All students that attend a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) campus
- All students that attend a Provision 2 campus
- All students certified for free or reduced-price meals via:
 - The household application
 - SNAP participation
 - TANF participation
 - Headstart participation
 - Medicaid participation
 - Homeless designation
 - Runaway designation
 - Migrant designation
 - Foster designation

2. I have a school campus that does not participate in the National School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program. Are those students eligible for P-EBT?

No, P-EBT is intended for students that would have received a meal through the National School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program.

3. I serve free meals to students through provision 2 at breakfast only. Are all students eligible for P-EBT?

Yes, if free meals are served to all students through provision 2 in breakfast or lunch, all students at the campus are eligible for P-EBT.

4. I serve free meals to all students outside of Provision 2 and CEP through a non USDA program. Are all students eligible for P-EBT?

No, only those students that are certified for free and reduced price meals through the National School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program are eligible for P-EBT.

5. I serve free meals to all students through provision 2 or CEP. Which students are eligible for P-EBT?

All students that attend CEP and P2 campuses are eligible for P-EBT.

6. Are pre-K students eligible for P-EBT?

Yes, pre-k students are eligible for P-EBT.
