




TEM Texas Public Schools COVID-19 Data

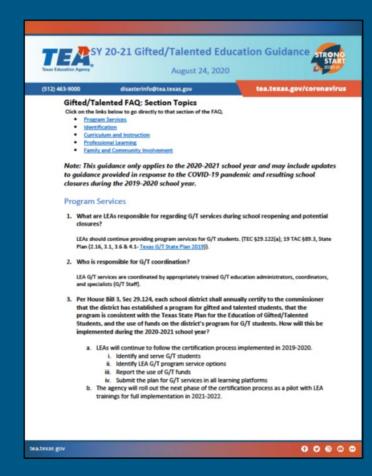

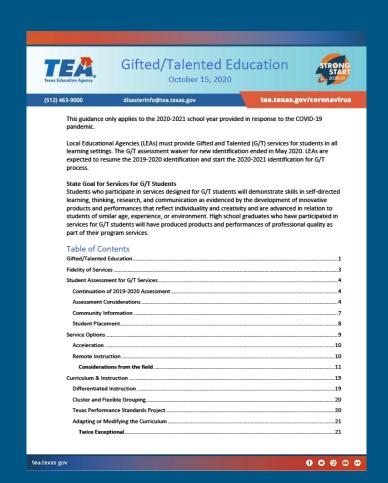

State Definition

The State definition: "...gifted and talented students" means: a child or youth who performs at or shows the potential for performing at a remarkably high level of accomplishment when compared to others of the same age, experience, or environment and who:

- Exhibits high performance capability in an intellectual, creative, or artistic area,
- Possess an unusual capacity for leadership, or
- Excels in a specific academic field.



State Goal for Gifted/Talented

Students who participate in services designed for gifted/talented students will demonstrate skills in self-directed learning, thinking, research and communication as evidenced by the development of innovative products and performances that reflect individuality and creativity and are advanced in relation to students of similar age, experience, or environment. High school graduates who have participated in services for gifted/talented students will have produced products and performances of professional quality as part of their program services.







HB 1525 Overall Actions

- Extends the reading academy deadline by 1 year to 2022-23.
- Restores the gifted/talented allotment (0.07 weight, 5% student cap).
- Updates CTE funding weights, and fixes a related issue for small and mid-sized districts
- Updated fast growth allotment
- Updates to comp ed funding, including more funds for students experiencing homelessness
- CCMR bonus expanded to include students earning an Associate Degree
- Creates a new "Resource Campus" funding option
- Increases technology purchase reimbursements
- Provides new funding for COVID 19 support:
 - PTECH
 - Learning Acceleration Supports
 - Tutoring
 - Reimbursement for districts not otherwise receiving federal funds
- Winter storm Uri reimbursements



Sec.48.109. GIFTED AND TALENTED STUDENT ALLOTMENT.

- (a) an annual allotment equal to the basic allotment multiplied by 0.07
- (b) Not more than 5% of a district's ADA
- (c) Must used in providing G/T programing
- (d) Must account for the expenditure of state funds
- (e) Must refund the allotment if the district fails to implement a G/T program



- Texas Commission on Virtual Education
 - The commission is established to develop and make recommendations regarding the delivery of virtual education in the public school system and state funding for virtual education under the Foundation School Program.
 - Report by December 1, 2022
 - 13 appointed members
 - Classroom teacher
 - Administrator
 - Community Member



- Development of civic essential knowledge and skills
- Any social studies course in the required curriculum
 - a teacher may not be compelled to discuss a particular current event or widely debated and currently controversial issue of public policy or social affairs
 - Limits on grades or course credit for social or public policy advocacy
 - Require to engage in training that presents any form of race or sex stereotyping, or blame based on race or sex



- Development of civic essential knowledge and skills
- Any social studies course in the required curriculum
- May not accept private funding for the development of curriculum or professional development
- May not implement, interpret, or enforce any rules or student code of conduct in a manner that would result in the punishment of a student for discussing, or have a chilling effect on student discussion of, the concepts




